iTILT's key exploitation strategy realized

The project partners recently obtained Comenius/Grundtvig status for their research-based professional development course 'Using Interactive Whiteboards (IWB) in Language Education'. The course is based on the classroom practice research and resources developed in the course of the 2-year project lifetime and it is open to all interested in language teaching with the IWB, experienced or not.

Two course sessions and locations will be offered in 2013:

- July, 15-19, Department of Applied Linguistics, Technical University Valencia (Spain)
- August, 12-16, Faculty of Education, Aveiro University, (Portugal)

iTILT on WorldCALL in July 2013 in Glasgow

iTILT will be at WorldCALL, presenting on a strand called "Discussion of CALL that reaches beyond the hype and the latest gadget to encompass longer term priorities and goals." This neatly summarises the approach to technology in this project. This international conference, to be held in Europe for the first time, brings together researchers and practitioners in computer-assisted language learning (CALL). In a paper entitled 'Interaction and interactivity in technology-rich second language classrooms: the iTILT project in France.' iTILT-partner Shona Whyte will present research based on data collected from the nine French teachers involved in iTILT.

iTILT at NL annual GFL teachers Conference

iTILT partner TELLConsult has been invited by the organisers of the annual National Conference for teachers of German as a second language in the Netherlands to present 'The use of Interactive Whiteboards in modern language education practice: a European perspective'. The presentation will focus on the experience gained during the European project iTILT. In this workshop we present a number of project results including the community webportal offering a database with video documents reporting the actual classroom practice of MFL teachers in 6 EU countries and a library of annotated links to external resources such as IWB files collections and relevant research literature.
