Welcome to our new iTILT newsletter, a quarterly publication aimed at keeping you informed as the project develops.

ABOUT iTILT

The European project iTILT (www.itilt.eu) explores ways to integrate the interactive whiteboard into communicative language teaching, offering research-based resources in several languages including tips for language teachers, training materials, and examples of activities for learners of different levels and ages. As the project progresses, our website will offer classroom illustrations including class video clips with teacher and learner comments and related teaching materials.

About Interactive Whiteboards (IWBs)

Interactive whiteboards may look like normal whiteboards, but can significantly transform the language classroom. For this to happen, teachers need to be given adequate training and support in how to use the tool communicatively, to be aware of strategies and procedures for designing effective IWB materials, and to have the opportunity to reflect on their own practice.

iTILT project progress

We have recently completed the first draft of the training handbook and criteria for IWB materials design, which will be the basis of the project training (to take place later in the year). We look forward to working with our associate partners and receiving feedback on this very soon.
